St. Paul follows a combination of the ALICE program and the "I Luv You Guys" program regarding terminology during a crisis management event. This is the same as D231 uses. Please make a note of this in case we have cause to utilize any of the steps listed below.

HOLD 1. Students clear the hallways and remain in room or area until the "All Clear" is announced. Do business as usual. 2. Adults close and lock door and account for all students and adults. Do business as usual.

SECURE 1. Students return to inside of building. Do business as usual. 2. Teachers bring everyone indoors, check that outside doors are locked as they should always be, increase situational awareness, take attendance, do business as usual.

LOCKDOWN 1. Students move away from sight and maintain silence. Do not open the door. 2. Adults recover students from hallway if possible. Lock the classroom door, turn out the lights and move away from sight. Silence should be maintained and the door should not be opened.
